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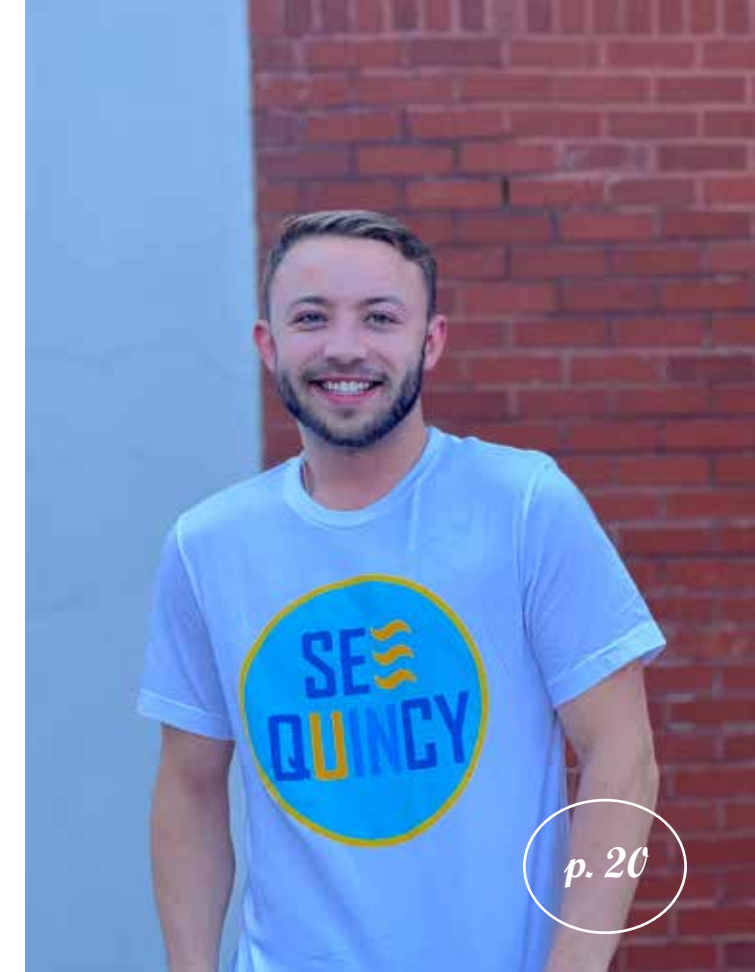

For 46 years running, the proud owners of pre-1949 street rods gather en masse in Quincy for a public show & tell. The bright rides of the **Early Tin Dusters Fall Color Run** speckle the landscape every October.

Summertime in our historic city on the bay is the ideal season for

music lovers to visit. Washington Park is home to free **Blues in the District**. Rock and Country fans pour into town for one of the best music fests in the Midwest, **RiverFest Quincy**, with the Mississippi River shamelessly photobombing in the background.

Our dining options number over 130, with half locally owned. **Summer Flavor Tours** offer guided foodie adventures to five eateries, peppered with intriguing nuggets of downtown history, and the **Mississippi Valley Wine Trail** is a four-season must.

We've got a MAJOR crush on our architecture. It's the crowning jewel of the city. With four National Register Historic Districts and over 3,600 properties contributing to it, the styles literally range from A-Z. Three self-guided tours chart the way year-round. **Abundant Architecture** features 48 properties with an 18-home stroll through the East End Historic District. **Mid Mod Quincy** showcases 30 prime examples of this marvelous era. And the **Maine Street Mile** is a 60-minute tour of our most beloved thoroughfare. Sure to make you smile. **Enjoy:)**

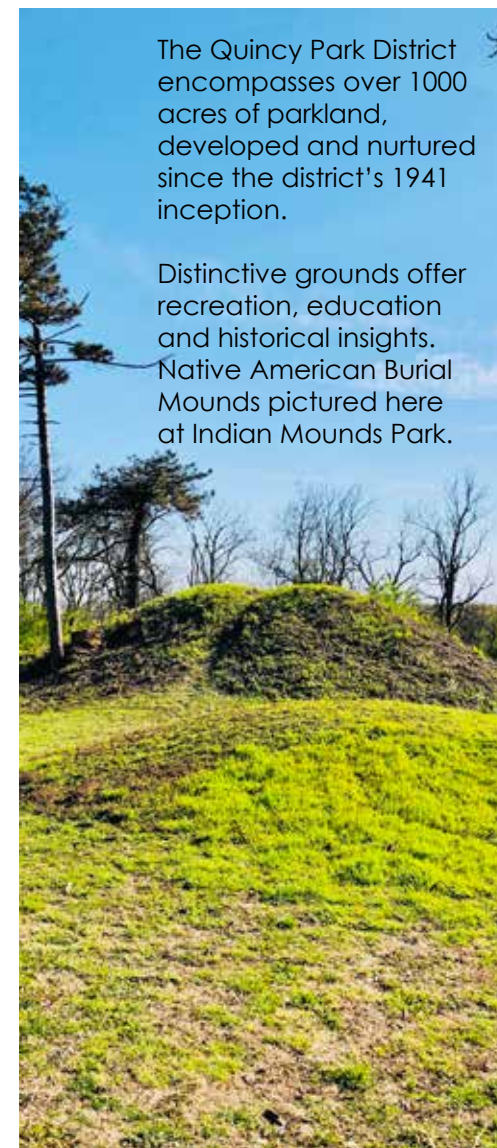

Quincy is a culinary playground for creative chefs and curious foodies alike. We're proud of our 65+ locally owned eateries and bars with food. Some of our favorites are those that source their supplies from the dedicated community of farmers in the Quincy surrounds. At Thyme Square Bakery & Café, the house chefs butcher, cure, and smoke the local meats. Rotating menus are created from seasonal produce, and hearty artisanal breads are made with local ingredients.

Sample more homegrown love at the Farmers Market in historic Washington Park, where you'll find fresh produce, honey & jams, and scratch made treats, May-Oct.

Downtown Quincy also offers a festive array of classic bars, cocktail hotspots and the city's only craft brewery, Quincy Brewing Company. The owners' passion for craft beer and the historic downtown culminated into QBCo, brewing exceptional ales, lagers and seltzers. Watch for Makers Markets, food truck events, trivia, bingo and other community oriented events. Enjoy one of their 18 beers on tap in The Tasting Room or in their outdoor patio—The Garden.

SPIRIT KNOB WINERY



57&VINE

**SEVEN FAMILY-OWNED WINERIES** and vineyards form the tapestry of our meandering trail, from Nauvoo to Rockport, Illinois. Each holds a unique story and timeline. The oldest winery in Illinois, **Baxter's Vineyards**, has been family owned and operated since 1857. It resides at the northernmost point of the trail less than a mile from the Great River Road and offers self-guided tours, a full bar, and The Nauvoo Grand Bed & Breakfast.

**Spirit Knob Winery** is nestled on the bluffs, opening to sweeping panoramic views of the Mississippi River Valley. Estate wines from French-American hybrids are produced onsite from the winery's vineyards. Holding over 250 medals, Spirit Knob is one of the most award-winning wineries in the state of Illinois.

The latest to join the trail is a refreshing tasting room just south of Quincy on the grounds of Pointe D'Vine. **57&Vine** was established in 2021 and offers majestic views and exquisite sunsets. The tasting room serves six varieties of wine, domestic beer, coffee, and small plates. A cozy fireplace completes the indoor ambiance.

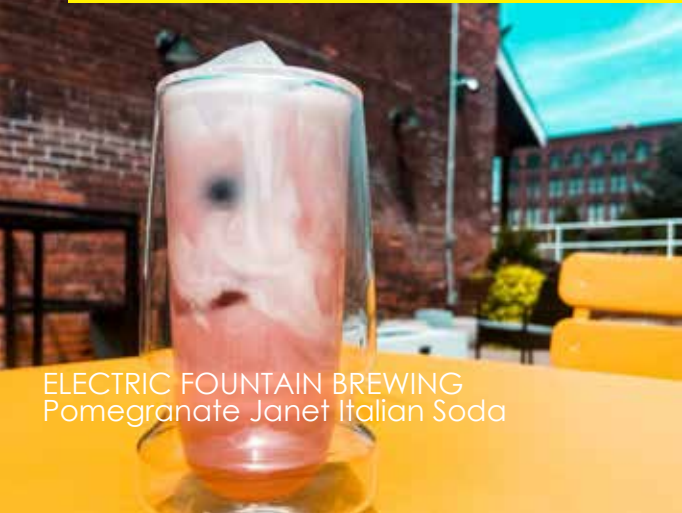

Learn about the evolution of farming. It's FREE. The **1930s Ag Museum** in rural Quincy features a private collection of John Deere implements and farm items of the decade and before. Individual & group tours (4th grade & up) available by appointment.

**A MEDITERRANEAN CASTLE ON THE MISSISSIPPI?** Yes, please. The Villa Kathrine was built in 1900 for Quincy native W. George Metz at a cost of \$7,000. The interior features a harem room, courtyard, and reflecting pool, largely based upon George's sketches of Islamic architecture during his global travels. Today, the Villa is open for tours and home to the SeeQuincy offices.

# MAINE STREET MILE:)

The 60-minute self-guided tour of Quincy's most notable thoroughfare is sure to make you smile. From Washington Park to Madison Park, explore the city's two oldest parks and experience the cultural & culinary wonders in between.

Begin your Maine Street excursion with John Wood, our city founder. Three blocks from the Mississippi his stately replica marks the southwest corner of the park that hosted the sixth of the Great Debates of 1858. It's estimated over 12,000 attendees gathered here to witness the heated discourse between Abraham Lincoln and Stephen A. Douglas.

Taste locally made coffees, cocktails, and menus, from corner bar food to fine dining. There's even the cutest tiny popcorn shop you've ever seen (pictured above). Enjoy art galleries, boutique stores, and magnificent commercial and religious structures holding architectural and historical significance.

Heading east, Maine gives way to deep, expansive lawns providing the foreground to a bevy of stunning historic homes. The tour concludes at Madison Park, the perfect grounds to relax, recreate and picnic.

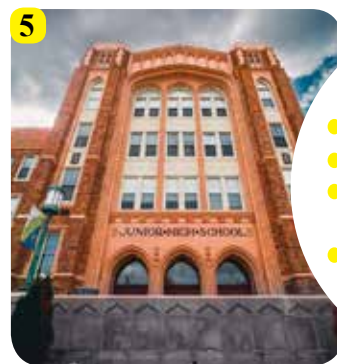

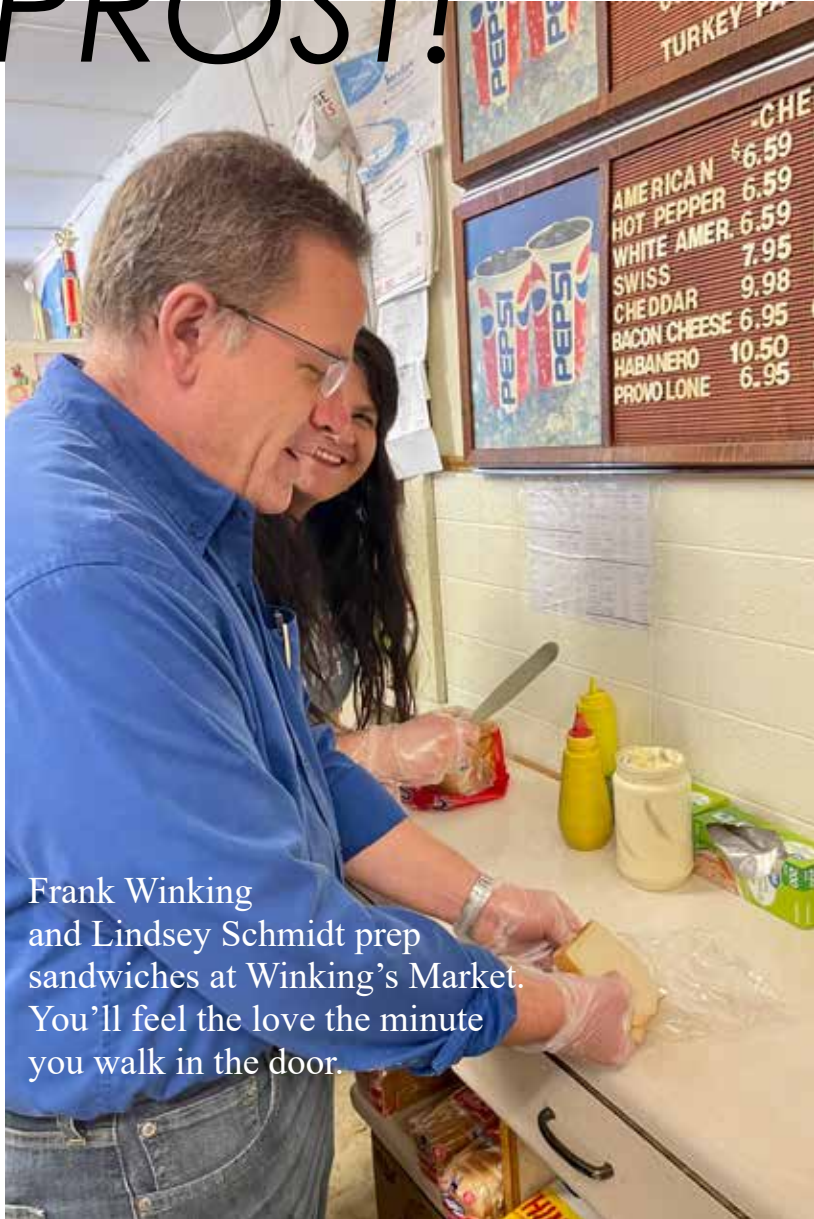

Quincy thoroughfares proudly and prolifically bear the signature style of Mid-Century Modern architect, John Benya.

More than 500 buildings across the country were designed by Benya, everything from factories to churches and public housing to banks. His works include several of Quincy's most prominent public spaces and remain some of the most admired buildings in western Illinois today.



## BENYA CRUSH

John Benya attended Northwestern University outside of Chicago and served in the Navy during World War II. Following his marriage to Virginia in 1947, he began practicing in Quincy with his earliest designs dating to 1949.

Easily recognizable about town in his swanky white Cadillac and a cigar between his fingers, Benya was an amiable fellow, well-liked among his peers. He built his own home for his family of five in the Lincoln Hill subdivision and developed many progressive residences, outfitted with state-of-the-art appliances, lighting and intercom systems.

St. Boniface Church is considered Benya's finest work, with its towering steeple an iconic landmark in Quincy's downtown. Friends refer to the masterpiece as his favorite and most spiritually inspired work. The modernistic terminal at Quincy Regional Airport is also a Benya work of art, featuring bold circular patterns and a blue-glass skylight. As the story goes, he concepted the design using a bar glass and a napkin over cocktails one evening. He dumped his martini out, turned the glass upside down, and drew a set of seven circles in a grouping. Those seven circles became the foundation for the terminal's blueprint. Upon the airport's completion, Benya was quoted as saying "All of my designs are original, and I never do the same thing twice."

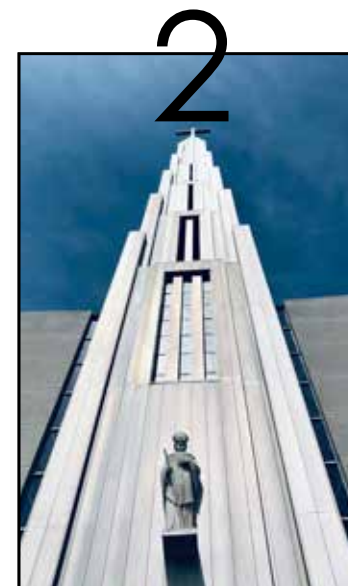

**636 Hampshire** / First Mid Bank & Trust / 1969-1973

Originally built for Gem City Savings & Loan and constructed around an original 1939 building, this complex has a large cantilevered wing over the bank drive-thru and maintains a full city block. The plaza on the grounds offers a wonderful green space for events in The District.



**701 Maine** / St Boniface Church / 1962

A modernistic & iconic masterpiece in the downtown skyline, terrazzo floors and stone walls envelope the interior. The 160-ft steeple is constructed of a steel shell with stainless steel interior, designed to house the historic three bells from the original church, as well as the heating & air conditioning. Named by the IL Association of Architects as one of Illinois' 150 most important structures.

*The building may be reopened as a shrine to Augustus Tolton, the first Black Roman Catholic priest in the U.S., ordained on this site in 1886.*



**2409 Country Club Drive South** / 1954 / Built at a cost of \$35,000

One of Quincy's most iconic mid-mod homes, "The Kuna House" included innovative features of glass support walls, heated cork, and indoor garden with koi pond. Here, as with Frank Lloyd Wright's Usonian houses, Benya blurred the distinction between indoor and outdoor space.



**2923 Lincoln Hill SW** / 1953

Benya's family home in the subdivision he fashioned himself, modeled after those designed by Joseph Fidler in California. The landscape of this home reflects the waves of the ocean in the buff brick serpentine wall that encloses the property. The interior is also comprised of characteristics common in Benya homes. Cypress wood accents the living room ceiling and windows, and the attached garage served double duty as a supplemental entertaining space.



**3001 Lincoln Hill NE** / 1956

The only International Modernism home in Quincy, a rare gem featuring glass designed to replicate the Northern Lights as light reflects during rain (30th Street facade), renovated using glass from Colorado.

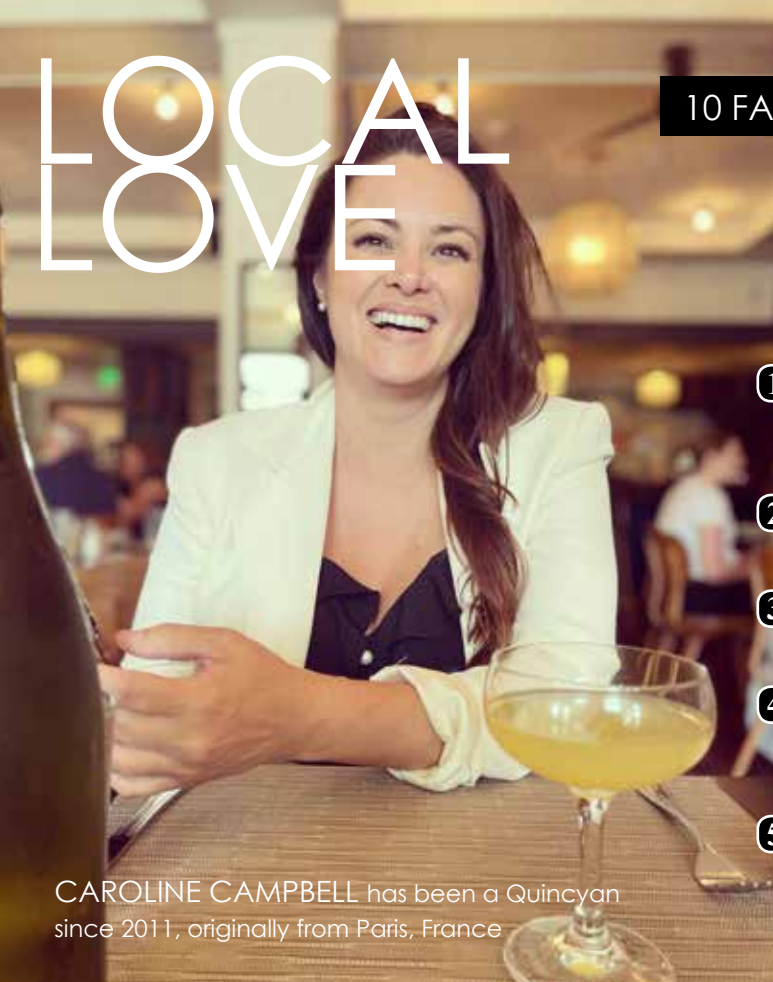


**Quincy Regional Airport Terminal**

The futuristic airport terminal was a definite coup in Benya's portfolio, a circle of many circles on a split three-level plan. The exterior walls are made entirely of brown-toned, half-circle windows separated by upward-curving sections of a striking green masonry.
